



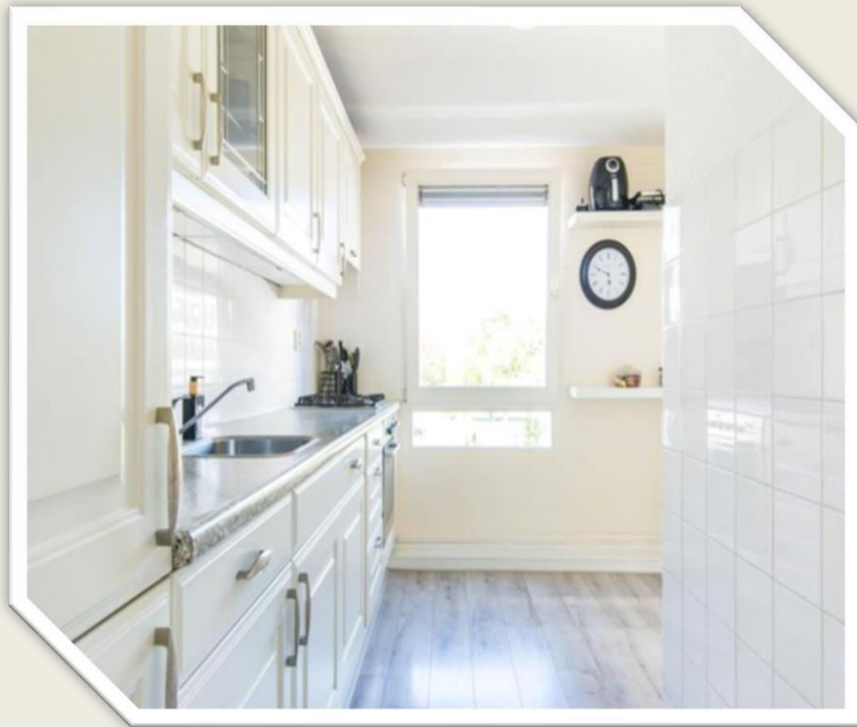
Tips To Manage Your Privacy In Shared Apartments In Amsterdam
